

BEAUSOLEIL FIRST NATION COVID-19 RESPONSE MODIFIED LEVEL 5

Updated December 1, 2020

Using Ontario's Covid-19 Response Framework restrictions

General public health measures (gatherings, workplace requirements and face coverings)

- Non-essential travel should be avoided. Avoid travel to **RED and GREY ZONES**.
- **Travel restriction to ALL visitors**
- **Visitor Request Form** will be turned off and replaced with **ESSENTIAL SERVICE REQUEST**. All protocols currently in place must be followed.
- Masks are **MANDATORY** in all indoor settings.
- Non-essential business continue to operate at 75% capacity with customer and employee safety protocols in place
- Emergency food supply available to Cedar Point and Christian Island households in isolation and food security maintained
- Delivery companies restricted to those on approved list as identified by EOT.
- Events and social gatherings (for example, barbeques):
 - 5 people indoors
 - 25 people outdoors
- No organized public events and gatherings:
- Religious services, weddings and funerals:
 - 30% capacity indoors
 - 100 people outdoors
- Requirement for workplace screening. Testing for frontline workers weekly.
- Face coverings **required** in:
 - indoor workplaces
 - indoor public spaces
- Where patrons without face coverings are within two metres of workers, workers must use additional protections such as eye protection
- Workplaces must develop and implement a communication/public education plan (highlighting risk)
- Physical distancing must be maintained
- Contact information for **ALL** visitors.

Transportation

- To verify you are a resident of BFN Territory, identification may be required.
- Maintain current ferry schedule
- Maintain passenger and vehicle fares
- Health screening at Cedar Point and Christian Island terminals as mandated by Transport Canada and Beausoleil Family Health Centre
- Vehicle passenger capacity limit of **98** on the M.V. Sandy Graham and a passenger capacity limit of **28** on the M.V. Indian Maiden
- Masks are **MANDATORY** on all Beausoleil First Nation ferries. Captains and crew reserve the right to enforce mask policy.
- Chimnissing Transit operational on a limited schedule, servicing residents of BFN Territory only.

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Education

- Full-time attendance starting Wednesday November 25th, 2020 from Monday to Thursday. Fridays are scheduled for sanitization purposes.
- Mna Bmaadzijig and Beausoleil Daycare Centre will remain open.

Restaurants, bars and other food and drink establishments

- Capacity limit based on facility size or 30%.
- Require patrons to be seated; 2 metre minimum between tables
- No buffet style service, Pot-luck etc.,
- Line-ups and patrons congregating outside venues managed by venue; 2 metres distance and face covering required
- Face coverings except when eating or drinking only
- Eye protection where patrons without face coverings are within 2 metres of workers
- Require contact information for all seated patrons
- Limit of 4 people may be seated together
- Require screening of patrons (for example, questionnaire)
- A safety plan must be available upon request

Sports and recreational fitness facilities

- Gyms and fitness studios permitted to be open with maximum of:
 - 10 people indoors or 25 people outdoors in classes; and
 - 10 people indoors in areas with weights or exercise equipment
- No spectators permitted (exemption for parent and guardian supervision of children)
- Increase spacing between patrons to 3 metres for areas of a sport or recreational facility where there are weights or exercise equipment and in exercise and fitness classes
- Team sports must not be practiced or played except for training (no games or scrimmage)
- Activities that are likely to result in individuals coming within 2 metres of each other are not permitted; no contact permitted for team or individual sports, with an exemption for high performance, including parasport, athletes.
- Patrons may only be in the facility for 90 minutes except if engaging in a sport
- Limit volume of music to be low enough that a normal conversation is possible; measures to prevent shouting by both instructors and members of the public
- Face coverings required except when exercising
- Require contact information for all members of the public that enter the facility
- Require reservation for entry; one reservation for teams
- Screening of patrons is required, in accordance with instructions issued by the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health
- A [safety plan](#) is required to be prepared and made available upon request

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Meeting and event spaces

- Maximum of 10 people per facility or 25 outdoors
- Require contact information for all seated patrons
- Limit of 4 people may be seated together
- Require screening of patrons (for example, questionnaire)
- A safety plan must be available upon request

Retail

- Line-ups and patrons congregating outside venues managed by venue; 2 metre distance and face covering required
- Consider limiting capacity in stores in winter
- For stores:
 - Require screening of patrons at entrances (for example, questionnaire)
 - a safety plan must be available upon request
