Harvesting Support Applicant Criteria:

- Must be a Beausoleil First Nation member on the date of the application
- Eligible harvesting activities include but are not limited to:
 - Hunting, trapping, fishing, gardening for sustenance, maple syrup production (any size operation), apiaries, traditional food and medicine processing
- Provide quotes for requested items on your application
- Absolutely **NO cash advances** will be provided, no exceptions
- Cannot be used for the purchase of firearms, bows or ammunitions
- Maximum funding opportunity of \$500.00, per applicant, for the *Harvesting Support Program - 2022 Fall Call* for applicants. Should the amount applied for exceed the identified budget, applications will be screened by the Nookmis Committee for consideration
- **Applicants who received funding for the 2022 Spring/Summer Call-Out are ineligible for the Fall call-out.**

To Apply:

- Completely fill out, sign and date the ***Online Harvesting Support Program Application***, incomplete applications will not be considered. If you do not have access to a device, hard copies will be available at the Band Office Reception Desk.
- Attach supporting documentation to your application
- If you need help getting quotes, researching pricing or any other application support, please contact the Trust Office to make an appointment.
- ***Harvesting Support Program Applications*** are **due by October 6th, 2022 at 4:30 p.m.** EDT, no late applications will be considered
